Program Description

This certificate in global education provides students from all academic backgrounds the opportunity to explore educational systems in a global context. Students will examine both the foundations of education and human development. They will gain a solid understanding of the similarities and differences in education across culture, class and ability. Students will complete ten credits of course work exploring education in the United States and across the world. They will complete three credits working with students from a wide variety of backgrounds and take an additional nine credits exploring the role of culture, literature and technology in education.

Learning Outcomes

Students will:

- Analyze similarities and differences in educational systems around the world.
- Plan and implement instruction in informal educational settings.
- Use technology as an educational tool.
- Explore multiple perspectives in global education.
